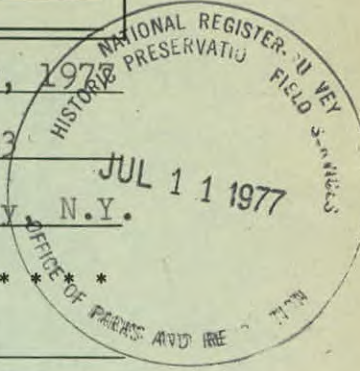

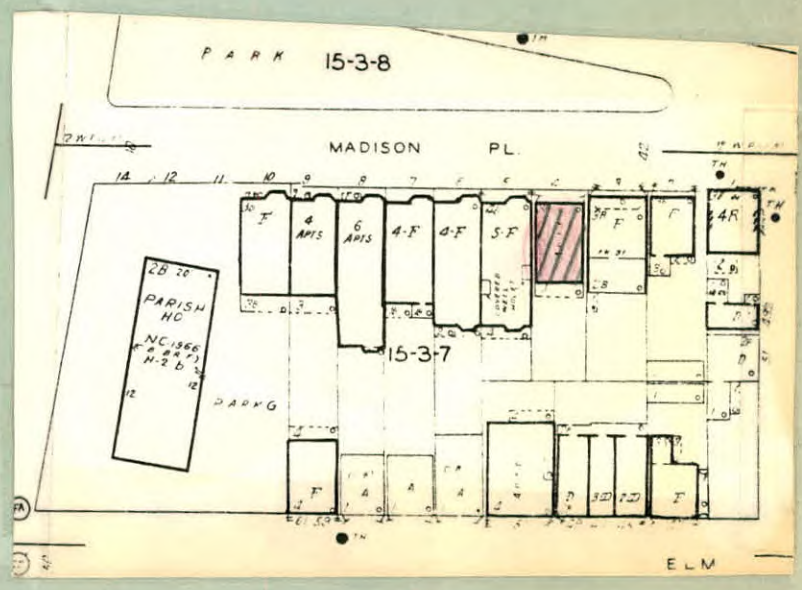

George Canaday of Canaday & Schultz a livery stable business, owned and occupied the house in 1872. From 1873-1882, Hiram L. Washburn Jr., an attorney, and his family, owned the house and lived there. John Hennessey, a bottler, and his family owned and occupied the house from 1884-1922.
