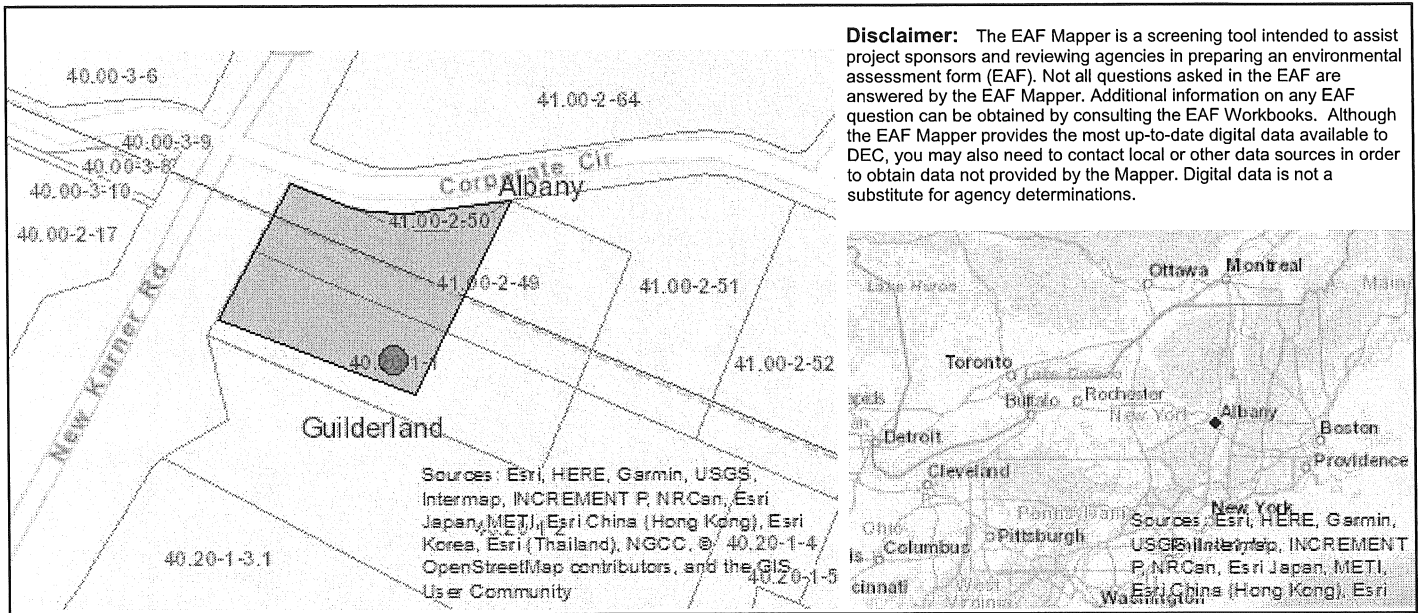

Location Desc: The affected area includes grounds maintenance (i.e., vegetation trimming) immediately around the Discovery Center and parking lot, emergency maintenance of infrastructure that may require excavation of already disturbed areas (i.e., repair of walkway drains, repair of waterlines) around the Discovery Center and parking lot, maintenance of existing trails (i.e., filling potholes, trimming vegetation alongside of trails, debris removal), and construction of 2.7 miles of new trail (mowing and/or scarification for vegetation removal). Mitigation is a component of the project. The plan is to restore 10 acres to suitable KBB habitat. This typically includes prescribed fire to reduce herbaceous and woody vegetation, followed by wild blue lupine seed plantings.
