Erin,

As an alternative to the brick, the only supplier from your list with a suitable product on the small scale that we need (100 sq ft) was Arriscraft/Grimm. The Arriscraft Renaissance product is described in the attached spec sheet. Grimm has them in stock; sufficient block to cover the stoop face would cost us \$900 plus tax and delivery. I am awaiting a quote from the mason on how much he would charge to lay the cast stone. I'm guessing it might be a bit more than the cost of laying brick because the cast stone is unbelievably dense/heavy. If the cost of laying the Arriscraft is not ridiculous in view of our profit margin, and if that's what the HRC wants, we could put that up instead of brick.

I will bring a sample of both the brick and the Arriscraft cast stone to the hearing tomorrow night, so people can inspect them. The piece of cast stone that I have is white; if we order 100 blocks, Grimm will tint them redbrown, but the HRC can at least see what the blocks look like. You'll have to imagine what it would look like in red-brown. I will also bring a couple pieces of the brownstone that we took down to show why we will not be re-installing the existing brownstone.
